#### **L3. LONE SCOUTS.**

##### **L3.1 Statement.**

The Scout Association of Australia, Western Australian Branch (“the Association”), provides opportunities for young people who, because of isolation through distance or other circumstances, and who are unable to be a regular member of any section within a Group, for them to join the Lone Scout Group.

L3.1.1 The basic aim of the Lone Scout Group is to provide Scouting for all youth members who cannot attend normal active meetings to have the opportunity to experience Scouting.

L3.2 In order that the Lone Scouts enjoy a very similar experience to that of their formation counterparts, Scouting activities are planned through the Lone Scout Leader for their respective section and supported by an Adult Helper in the local community.

L3.2.1 As a means to providing realism of Scouting, Lone Scouts come together at times throughout the year for camps, Branch activities or the like.
