### POLICIES and OPERATIONAL PROCEDURES MANUAL

#### **R2. R D CONTEST – PETER HUGHES TROPHY, BRANCH RADIO & ELECTRONICS.**

- R2.1 The official rules for the Remembrance Day (R D) Contest will be those issued by the Wireless Institute of Australia, R D Contest Coordinator.
- R2.2 The Peter Hughes Trophy is held as a Sub Contest in conjunction with the R D Contest.
- R2.3 The following rules are only for those stations that wish to be considered for the Peter Hughes Trophy.
- R2.3.1 A Scout Call Sign must be used, where available. If you are unable to use a Scout Call Sign you must register your Call Sign with the Scout Radio Team before you commence the R D Contest.
- R2.3.2. The Station must operate as multi-operator.
- R2.3.3. The Station can use HF and VHF bands.  
R2.3.3.1 Amateur Radio Operators must stay within their band limits.
- R2.3.4. The Station does not require a youth operator, but youth are encouraged to support operators.
- R2.3.5. The Station Log sheets must be forwarded to the Radio & Electronics Team for the scores to be checked. A copy must also be forwarded to the WIA RD Contest coordinator to help with the West Australian total score.
- R2.3.6. As the Station is operating under a Scout Station Call Sign (Club Station), a copy of names and addresses of all participants must be supplied with the Log sheets ( The Radio and Electronics Team will send out participation certificates).
- R2.3.7. After the Log sheets have been checked for their total scores, the Peter Hughes Trophy will be presented to the Scout Station with the highest number of points scored.
