Overview: The program must fit Healthway's guidelines and a minimum of four calendar months is required from the time of lodgement of the application at Healthway to the commencement of the program. Applications for these grants require a comprehensive outline of the program, objectives, strategies and evaluation. However, we would encourage you to discuss your ideas with us prior to submission.

- Good nutrition (high priority)
- Injury prevention
